In cases of suspected research or publication misconduct, it may be necessary for the Editor in chief to contact and share manuscripts with third parties, for example, author(s)' institution(s) and ethics committee(s).

Research misconduct

All research involving humans (including human data and human material) and animals must have been carried out within an appropriate ethical framework. If there is suspicion that research has not taken place within an appropriate ethical framework, the Editor in chief may reject a manuscript and may inform third parties, for example, author(s)' institution(s) and ethics committee(s).
